### Black River Streambank Management Area

#### **General Description**

The Black, Barton, and Clyde Rivers, along with their tributaries, make up the bulk of the Lake Memphremagog watershed and offer excellent fishing opportunities in northeastern Vermont. The Black River begins in Craftsbury and runs through Albany, Irasburg, Coventry, and Newport before emptying into Lake Memphremagog. Brook, Brown, and Rainbow Trout are present throughout Black River SMA, with wild Brook and Rainbow Trout more common in the headwaters. Steelhead also move throughout the river during their spring spawning migration. Yellow Perch, Bullhead, Smallmouth Bass, Fallfish, and White, Longnose, and Redhorse Sucker can be found downstream of Coventry Falls, including within Map 9 and South Bay WMA to the north.
