Lamoille River Streambank Management Area

General Description

The Lamoille River stretches from its headwaters in the Northeast Kingdom, across the state, to Lake Champlain. The fish found in the lower region are vastly different than those in the upper headwaters. The Lamoille River Streambank Management Area includes lands on the Lamoille and its tributaries in the headwaters and central region of the river. Small tributaries like Kenfield, Alder, Greensboro, and Porter brook are good for Brook and Brown Trout fishing. Many other species can be found in the mainstem, including Chain Pickerel, suckers, perch, Smallmouth Bass, and Rainbow Trout.

Section 1

General Description

The Lamoille River stretches from its headwaters in the Northeast Kingdom, across the state, to Lake Champlain. The fish found in the lower region are vastly different than those in the upper headwaters. Section 1 of this Streambank Management is home to several small tributaries of the Lamoille, Porter and Greensboro Brooks, each of which contain a healthy coldwater fishery with Brook and Brown Trout. Anglers may also find trout in parts of the mainstem where there is heavy tree cover, but warmwater fish like suckers and perch are more likely.

General Description

The Lamoille River stretches from its headwaters in the Northeast Kingdom, across the state, to Lake Champlain. The fish found in the lower region are vastly different than those in the upper headwaters. Brook and Brown Trout may be found in Section 2 of this Streambank Management Area, including in the Wild Branch in Wolcott and Alder Brook in Hardwick. Warmwater fish like suckers, perch, and Smallmouth Bass can be found in the mainstem, as well as stocked Rainbow Trout.



Section 3

General Description

The Lamoille River stretches from its headwaters in the Northeast Kingdom, across the state, to Lake Champlain. The fish found in the lower region are vastly different than those in the upper headwaters. Kenfield Brook (Map 4 & 5) in Morristown is a productive area for spawing Brook and Brown Trout, while the mainstem is regularly stocked with Rainbow Trout. Many other species can be found in the mainstem, including Chain Pickerel, suckers, perch, and Smallmouth Bass.
