Join Soil Conservationist **Olivia Carlson** of U.S. Dept. of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service and Habitat Biologist **Travis Hart** of Vermont Fish and Wildlife to walk through untreated and treated areas of invasive plants to identify these invaders and discuss control methods.

The group will meet at 493 West Road in Sandgate. You will see a Fire Pond on the right side of the road with a field next to the pond this is the correct location for parking.

The land the group will walk is privately owned by Mike and Leslie Perra who have worked with NRCS to control invasive plants within their forestland. The group will start by walking up to the west through untreated invasive plant areas to discuss identification of various common invasive plants found in Vermont's forest. Then we will continue to a controlled site completed within the last 2 years to discuss the options for control and the benefits and drawbacks to each. The group will loop back to the parking area by 12 pm.

Please dress for the weather and wear suitable footwear. We encourage you to bring water, a journal for notes, as well as an eagerness to learn about how to control
